
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Bell's palsy

Bell's palsy is an acute, apparently isolated, lower motor neuron facial palsy for which no cause can be found. Presumed to be viral due to HSV 1 (viral genomic sequences detected).

A etiology:-

- Associated known clinical conditions – Diabetes, severe hypertension, last trimester of pregnancy, dental and aesthesia.
- Causes – (i) Exposure to cold; oedema and subsequent compression of nerve trunk within the rigid Fallopian canal causes Circulatory disturbance.
(ii) Other Important causes of acute facial palsy include suppurative otitis media, herpes zoster, head injury, Guillain-Barre syndrome, sarcoidosis and multiple Sclerosis.

Symptoms:-

Sudden, following exposure to chill or without any apparent precipitating cause, maximum paralysis in 24 hours.

Post auricular pain is common and may precede paralysis by 2 days. There may be spontaneous complaints of loss of sense of taste, hyperacusis and watering of the eye. Sweating less on affected side.

Signs:-

- Forehead cannot be wrinkled; frowning lost (frontalis).
- Eye cannot be closed (orbicularis oculi, sphincter of palpebral fissure). On attempting closure, eyeball turns upwards and outwards (Bell's phenomena).
- On showing the teeth, the lips do not separate on affected side. Whistling not possible. Articulation of labial components difficult. Nasolabial fold flattened out. Angle of mouth on affected side droops with dribbling of saliva Orbicularis oris, sphincter of oral fissure).
- Cheek puffs out with expiration because of buccinators paralysis. Food collects between teeth and Paralyzed Cheek. Fluid runs out while drinking (buccinator).
- Base of tongue lowered (stylohyoid and posterior belly of digastric).
- Vesicles within the external auditory meatus and ear drum in Ramsay Hunt syndrome. Pain may precede facial weakness. Deafness may result.

Investigation

Electromyography – of prognostic importance: (a) If signs of denervation after 10 days – Axonal degeneration, recovery incomplete or delayed. (b) If incomplete denervation in less than 7 days – Good prognosis. (c.) Fibrillation

Potential after 2 weeks suggests Wallerian degeneration.

Management

1. Local heat – Infra-red or moist heat, or short wave diathermy over face or parotid region or both, if there is tenderness of nerve trunk.
2. Local treatment of muscles – (a) The patient should massage the facial muscles with bland oil twice daily for 5 minutes. The massaging movements should start from the chin and lower lip and be directed upwards. With return of function the patient should practice movements of various muscles of face before a mirror. (b) Prevention of facial sagging – application of strips of adhesive tape to lift up the angle of the mouth. The tape is attached to the temple and extends down in a V shaped fashion to the upper and lower lips.
3. Protection of eye – with dark glasses or eye patch. The eye should be washed twice daily with mild zinc-boric solution to prevent conjunctivitis.
4. Corticosteroids
5. Antivirals – like acyclovir, valacyclovir or famciclovir in combination with steroids, if started within 3 days of onset.
6. Surgery – Decompression of facial nerve in second or third week cannot influence favourably natural course of Bell's palsy. In cases which fail to recover after 9 months anastomosis of facial with accessory or preferably hypoglossal nerve may be considered, or plastic surgery in cases of total paralysis with atrophy of musculature.
7. Treatment of sequelae – (a) Residual severe weakness – plastic surgery. (b) Faulty reinnervation resulting tears pouring from affected side on chewing (syndrome of crocodile tears) – cutting of tympanic nerve which normally conveys the glossopharyngeal salivary fibres.

Why Do We Need Multiple Repertories

In homoeopathy, multiple repertories are needed because there is no single "perfect" index that covers every clinical scenario, and each repertory is designed based on different philosophical principles, structures, and intended uses. The vastness of the Materia Medica (with over 5,000 remedies) requires various, specialized tools to filter through symptoms efficiently.

Here is why multiple repertories are essential:

1. Differences in Philosophical Approach

Repertories are structured according to specific methods of case analysis:

- **Deductive Logic (General to Particular): Kent's Repertory** is ideal for cases where mental and physical generals are clear.
- **Inductive Logic (Particular to General): Boenninghausen's Therapeutic Pocket Book (BTB)** is better suited when characteristic particulars, modalities, and concomitants are more prominent.
- **Boger's Approach (Pathological Generals): Boger Boenninghausen's Characteristics and Repertory (BBCR)** uses a combination of both, focusing on pathological generals.

2. Specialized Focus (Regional vs. General)

- **General Repertories (e.g., Kent, Synthesis, Murphy):** Used for chronic, deep-seated, and multi-systemic cases.
- **Regional/Clinical Repertories (e.g., Bell's Diarrhea, Minton's Uterine Therapeutics):** Essential for acute, localized, or specific disease conditions where symptoms are limited to a particular organ or system.

3. Different Types of Clinical Scenarios

- **Chronic Cases:** Require in-depth, comprehensive repertories (e.g., Synthesis) that include a wide range of mental and physical symptoms.
- **Acute/Emergency Cases:** Require rapid, concise repertories (e.g., Boericke, Boger's Synoptic Key) that offer quick reference and focus on keynotes.
- **One-Sided Diseases:** Need specialized repertories that can find clues in limited, or solely objective symptoms.

4. Variations in Data and Structure

- **Rubric Representation:** A rubric that is large in one repertory (e.g., Kent) might be small or better defined in another (e.g., Complete Repertory).
- **Gradation:** Different authors (Kent, Boenninghausen, Boger) have different ways of ranking remedies (3, 4, or 5 grades), which can change the outcome of the analysis.
- **Inclusion of New Remedies:** Newer repertories like Synthesis or Murphy's contain modern Proving and remedies not found in older classics.
